

#### Goole

About Goole - the place we're holding our events

Goole is a town, civil parish and port located approximately 45 miles (72 km) inland on the River Ouse in the East Riding of Yorkshire. The port is "highly versatile", and is capable of handling nearly three million tonnes of cargo per annum, making it one of the most important ports on the east coast of England.

The town's population is 17,600 and is twinned with Złotów, Poland (and was twinned with Rostock, northern Germany in 1969). Goole was informally twinned with Gibraltar in the 1960s, at that time Gibraltar Court was named in Goole and Goole Court was named in Gibraltar.

It's a hidden gem from a business perspective and we hope those who attend agree that it's a place on the up. Alongside neighbouring Howden, Goole is the UK home of a number of multi-nationals including: Guardian Glass, ebuyer and the Press Association.
