This year's Yorkshire International Business Convention (YIBC), the grand finale to Humber Business Week 2009, has a line-up of high-profile speakers that demonstrates to delegates that anything is possible. Tim Smit was responsible for turning a derelict Cornish clay pit into one of the country's leading tourist attractions - The Eden Project.

Business guru and author Tim Sanders formerly led the 'Blue Sky Think Tank' at Yahoo. Tracy Edwards MBE skippered the first all-female crew to take part in the Round the World Yacht Race and then fought back from business bankruptcy.

Dave Stewart, perhaps best-known as one half of the Eurythmics, is also a remarkable business innovator and international business consultant.

Matthew Pritchett, is the awardwinning cartoonist Matt and combines humour, biting satire and social comment every day in the Daily Telegraph. Tim Sanders is the author of Love Is The Killer App: How To Win Business and Influence Friends, which was a New York Times and international best seller.

The Yorkshire International Business Convention will be held at the Bridlington Spa on Friday 06 June 2009. The venue will hold around 670 delegates and the event organisers are urging people to book early as there are less than 100 tickets remaining.
